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I. Mission, Vision, and Executive Summary:

Mission:

Our mission at Bultum Academy is to address the academic and socio-emotional needs of our students. We achieve this by offering a focused and enriching learning environment in science, technology, engineering, and math (STEM), complemented by a positive school culture strengthened through family partnerships.

Vision:

Bultum Academy aspires to be acknowledged as a distinctive and innovative educational institution. We aim to actively engage, empower, and cater to the specific educational needs of a high-risk and underserved population of students.

Executive Summary:

Overview:

In its second year of operation, Bultum Academy has made significant strides in achieving its mission of providing a focused and enriching learning environment in science, technology, engineering, and math (STEM). This report highlights key aspects of the school's performance, initiatives, and goals.

Student Enrollment:

Bultum Academy surpassed its initial goal by enrolling 160 students in its first year, concluding with 153 students. Despite a 22% attrition rate, strategic efforts led to a promising start for the new year with a total of 232 students.

Student Achievement:

In reading, the school's proficiency rate of 31.67% exceeded the district average by 4.82 percentage points. Similarly, in math, Bultum Academy achieved a commendable proficiency rate of 26.67%, surpassing the district's rate by 7.07 percentage points.



Parent Satisfaction:

The Parent Satisfaction Survey indicated a remarkable 96.67% satisfaction rate, reflecting the positive impact of the school's performance on the community. The feedback underscores the success of our programs and interventions.

Equitable Access and Diversity:

Bultum Academy is committed to ensuring equitable access to excellent teachers, with all educators possessing appropriate licensure. The school's diverse student body, with about 90% English Language Learners (ELL) and 87% qualifying for free or reduced-price lunch, reflects a dedication to fostering inclusivity.

Outlook:

As we strive for academic excellence and meeting the needs of our diverse student population, Bultum Academy looks ahead to sustained growth, exemplary performance, and innovative approaches to education. The collaborative efforts of our educators, administrators, and community stakeholders pave the way for a promising future.

II. Student Enrollment, Attendance, and Demographics:

Student Enrollment:

In its inaugural year, Bultum Academy embarked on a journey with the ambitious goal of enrolling 150 students. The school not only met this target but exceeded expectations by successfully recruiting 160 students when it opened its doors in September. As the academic year progressed, the student body experienced some fluctuations, concluding the year in June with a total enrollment of 153.

Throughout the course of the year, the school faced the challenge of retaining students, resulting in a slight decrease in enrollment by seven students. Despite this, Bultum Academy remained resilient and concluded the academic year above the initial goal set for student enrollment.

A notable aspect of Bultum Academy's commitment to the community was the voluntary provision of education to approximately 23 pre-kindergarten students. It is essential to highlight that, as a first-year charter school, Bultum Academy did not receive funding from the Minnesota Department of Education (MDE) for these pre-K students. This decision was a strategic investment in the local community,



addressing both the high demand for pre-K education and establishing a valuable pipeline for future kindergarten classes.

In summary, Bultum Academy's first-year enrollment journey demonstrated a commendable achievement in surpassing initial goals, addressing community needs, and setting the stage for continued growth and success in the upcoming academic years.

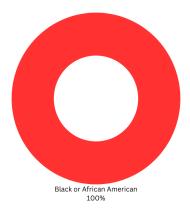
Attendance:

In its inaugural year, Bultum Academy prioritized student attendance with a targeted range of 90 to 94 percent to achieve a performance rating at the satisfactory level. However, the commitment to fostering a positive learning environment led to an impressive outcome. Bultum Academy not only exceeded the set target but achieved a remarkable attendance rate of 95.26 percent.

This outstanding attendance rate not only surpassed the expectations for a satisfactory performance but also earned Bultum Academy the highest performance rating of exemplary for consistently exceeding the benchmark of 94 percent. The commitment of students, parents, and the school community to prioritize attendance has significantly contributed to creating a thriving and conducive learning environment.

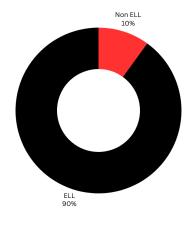

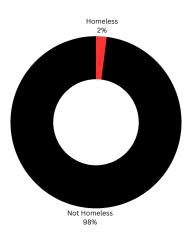

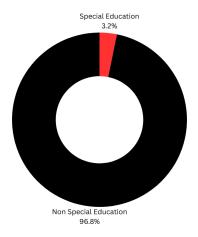












III. Student Attrition:

In the 2022-2023 academic year, Bultum Academy experienced an attrition rate of 22%, with 120 students returning out of the 153 enrolled at the end of the year. Despite this, the school has diligently addressed the attrition by successfully replacing those students and surpassing the initial expectations. As a result, the total student enrollment at the beginning of the new year reached 232.

Equitable Access to Highly Qualified Educators:

Throughout the 2022-2023 academic year, all our classroom teachers, specialists, and supporting staff possessed the requisite licensure for their assigned teaching roles. In instances where we faced challenges in securing licensed teachers with the necessary experience and background to effectively engage with our



students, we sought internal or external candidates and obtained Tier 1 for them. All grade level teams engage in collaborative planning for various subjects, ensuring alignment with state standards. Irrespective of their classroom placement, students are exposed to the same challenging grade-level standards, ensuring equal access to a robust and rigorous curriculum.

Bultum Academy places a strong emphasis on continuous professional development for our Executive Director to ensure effective leadership and stay abreast of the latest educational trends. During the 2022-2023 school year, our Executive Director actively participated in professional development opportunities sponsored by the school's authorizer, NEO.

Specifically, our Executive Director attended the NEO-sponsored "Celebration of Leading and Learning" workshops held in both fall and spring. These workshops were meticulously designed to address the unique challenges and opportunities faced by school leaders. The comprehensive content covered in these sessions aimed to enhance leadership skills, foster innovation, and provide valuable insights into effective school management.

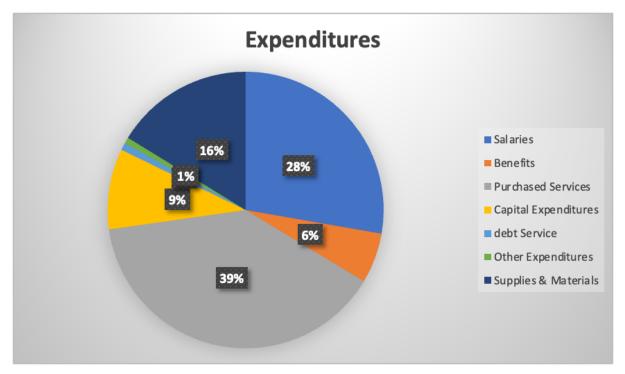

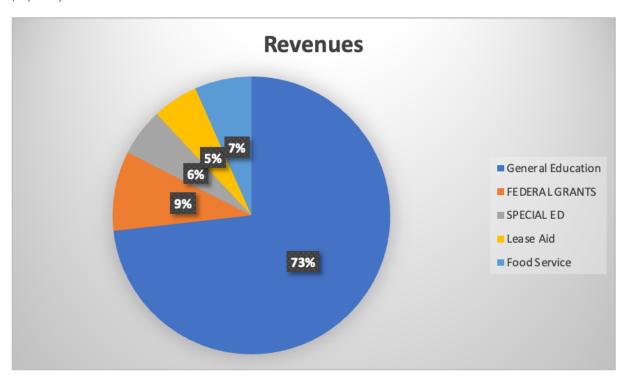

IX. Academic Performance:

As our student body predominantly comprised individuals from minority racial and ethnic backgrounds, including recent immigrants to the country, with approximately 90% designated as English Language Learners (ELL) and 87% qualifying for free or reduced-price lunch, our student achievement objectives were aligned with the principles of the World's Best Workforce legislation. The primary focus was to ensure that all third-grade students attain grade-level literacy, with a concurrent commitment to closing all achievement gaps.

Our school has set strategic MCA-Math Goals for Grades 3-8 with a keen eye on surpassing the Columbia Heights resident district's averages. We've achieved a satisfactory level of performance with a proficiency rate of 26.67%, which is 7.07 percentage points higher than the district's rate of 19.60%. While we have not yet achieved an exemplary status — which would require us to be more than 10 percentage points above the district average — we are on a positive trajectory. Our efforts continue to focus on elevating our students' math proficiency as we strive to meet and exceed our targeted outcomes, contributing to the overarching objectives of the World's Best Workforce.

In the area of reading, our school has established a clear performance framework for MCA-Reading Goals, wherein our current proficiency rate stands at 31.67%. This exceeds our resident district's average by 4.82 percentage points, demonstrating our students' satisfactory performance in this critical academic area. Although we have not reached the exemplary rating, which requires surpassing the district average by more than 10 percentage points, our school remains committed to progressing towards this goal. Our efforts are ongoing to enhance literacy proficiency, with strategic initiatives focused on maintaining and exceeding our performance relative to the district average, aligning with the World's Best Workforce's emphasis on academic excellence.

Our school's MCA-Math proficiency for the FRP focus group has demonstrated commendable results, with a combined proficiency rate of 29.41%, which notably exceeds the resident district's average by 12.85 percentage points. This substantial margin underscores our commitment to closing the achievement gap and fostering an equitable learning environment. Our satisfactory performance reflects targeted efforts to support our economically disadvantaged students in math, a core academic skill. We continue to



build on these successes to sustain and extend our lead above the resident district average, aligning with our strategic goals and the broader aspirations of the World's Best Workforce initiative.

Our school has set rigorous MCA-Reading Goals for Grades 3-8 for the FRP focus group, aiming to exceed the proficiency rates of our resident district. Currently, our school's combined proficiency rate stands at 33.33%, which is 10.95 percentage points higher than the district average of 22.39%. This achievement reflects our school's dedication to surpassing standard educational benchmarks and our commitment to improving literacy among our students. Our satisfactory performance indicates the effectiveness of our reading programs and interventions. As we continue our efforts, we aim to not only



maintain this lead but also strive for exemplary status by creating an even wider gap above the district average, ensuring alignment with the objectives of the World's Best Workforce.

Our educational strategy for students below grade level in math has been effective, as evidenced by the 84.92% of students who have met the rigorous NWEA MAP growth targets from fall to spring. With 760 actual RIT growth points achieved against an expectation of 895, our students have made substantial progress. This exemplary growth rate, which applies to all 66 students identified as below grade level, demonstrates our commitment to ensuring that students not only make progress but also exceed growth projections. Our focused interventions and targeted instructional strategies have been instrumental in this



achievement, which aligns with the World's Best Workforce's goal of all students graduating from high school well-prepared for academic success.

XI. Professional Development:

Continuous, job-embedded professional development remains a cornerstone of our commitment to excellence at Bultum Academy. The Academic Coach provided targeted observations and coaching to our dedicated teaching staff.

For the academic year 2022-2023, our professional development focuses on key areas:

The Science of Reading:

• Utilizing Groves Literacy Organization's interim assessment in conjunction with aimswebplus data and The Science of Reading to inform early literacy instruction.

Data-Driven Instruction:

- Employing NWEA MAP data to inform English Language Arts (ELA) and Math instruction.
- Using classroom assessment data and NWEA MAP data to plan targeted small group instruction across all subject areas.

During the workshop weeks in August and September, our teachers participated in full-day workshops covering:

- Introduction to new curricula, including Groves Literacy, HMH Reading, HMH Math, HMH Science, HMH Social Studies, and a reading and listening software called Amira.
- Collaborative work to align curriculum standards with Minnesota State Standards.
- Effective classroom management strategies to optimize instructional time.

Furthermore, every Friday afternoon (with early student dismissal), teachers engage in 2 hours of professional development, accumulating close to 60 hours over the school year. Specific focus areas during these sessions include:

Reading Instruction:

- Science of Reading training sessions for teachers.
- Understanding Scarborough's rope and the components of a skilled reader.
- Mastery of individual skills required for proficient reading.
- Administration and utilization of data from aimsweb reading fluency assessments to guide whole-group and targeted small group instruction.

Classroom and Behavior Management:

- Low Burden, High Impact behavior interventions.
- Positive behavior reinforcement strategies.
- Anti-bullying methods, including ongoing training on incorporating SEL curriculum to foster positive character development and promote kindness among students.



This comprehensive approach to professional development reflects our dedication to staying at the forefront of educational best practices and ensuring our students receive the highest quality instruction.

• For the years 2022-2023 and 2022-2026, the results show that 58 out of 60 parents surveyed agreed or strongly agreed with the school's performance, resulting in a 96.67% satisfaction rate.

Language instruction stands out as another innovative aspect of our school model. Offering two specialist classes daily, our students engage in learning both Oromo and Arabic, in addition to English—the primary language of instruction. Research consistently highlights the positive impact of exposure to students' native language on academic success and English language acquisition. Given that approximately 95 percent of our student body's native language is Oromo, our approach aligns seamlessly with research-based strategies for promoting success in school and English language proficiency among our diverse student population.

Furthermore, our commitment to daily physical education ensures that students have dedicated time for physical movement, complementing regular recess breaks. This comprehensive and innovative framework reflects our determination to provide a well-rounded and effective educational experience for our students.

Implement targeted training sessions for educators on effectively interpreting and applying assessment data to tailor instruction to individual student needs.
