I. Mission, Vision, and Executive Summary

Mission:

At Bultum Academy, our mission is to address the academic, social, and emotional needs of our diverse student body. We achieve this by providing an inclusive and enriching learning environment, with a strong focus on Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math (STEM) education. Our curriculum is enhanced by cultural learning opportunities, including language instruction and social-emotional development programs. Through close partnerships with families and the community, we foster a positive school culture that empowers students to excel academically, socially, and emotionally, preparing them to become confident, well-rounded leaders in their future pursuits.

Vision:

Bultum Academy aspires to be recognized as a distinctive and innovative educational institution. Our vision is to actively engage, empower, and meet the unique educational needs of high-risk and underserved students, fostering their academic excellence, personal growth, and lifelong success. We envision a supportive learning environment that celebrates diversity, encourages critical thinking, and promotes collaboration among students, families, and the community. By integrating culturally relevant curricula and providing tailored support services, we aim to inspire a love of learning and equip our students with the skills necessary to thrive in an ever-changing world.

Executive Summary

Overview:

In its second year of operation, Bultum Academy has continued to make impressive strides in its mission to provide a focused and enriching learning environment in science, technology, engineering, and math (STEM). The school has enhanced its curriculum with innovative teaching methods and hands-on learning, fostering critical thinking and problem-solving skills. Small class sizes ensure personalized attention for each student. Additionally, the Academy has expanded extracurricular programs, such as coding and robotics, preparing students for success in STEM fields. This report highlights key performance areas, initiatives, and future goals.

Student Enrollment:

Entering our second year, we achieved remarkable growth, ending the year with 217 students. This increase reflects our commitment to providing quality education and meeting the needs of our diverse community. Throughout the year, we maintained an impressive overall attendance rate of 95.07%, underscoring our dedication to fostering student engagement and success.

Student Achievement:

In Reading, the school's current year proficiency rate of 33.73% is 7.6 percentage points higher than the resident district's current proficiency rate of 26.13%. Similarly in Math, the school's current proficiency rate of 24.10% is 6.29 percentage points higher than the resident district's current proficiency rate of 17.81%.



Parent Satisfaction:

The Parent Satisfaction Survey indicated a remarkable 96.67% satisfaction rate, reflecting the positive impact of the school's performance on the community. The feedback underscores the success of our programs and interventions.

Equitable Access and Diversity:

Bultum Academy is committed to ensuring equitable access to excellent teachers, with all educators possessing appropriate licensure. The school's diverse student body, with about 98.5% English Language Learners (ELL) and 85% qualifying for free or reduced-price lunch, reflects a dedication to fostering inclusivity.

Outlook:

As we pursue academic excellence and cater to our diverse student population, Bultum Academy is committed to sustained growth, outstanding performance, and innovative educational practices. The collaborative efforts of our educators, administrators, and community stakeholders lay the foundation for a bright future.

II. Student Enrollment, Attendance, and Demographics

Student Enrollment:

In its second year, Bultum Academy experienced significant growth, ending the academic year with an impressive total of 217 students. By year-end, 23 new students had joined the roster, reflecting the school's expanding reach and reputation within the community. This growth underscores our commitment to delivering a high-quality, inclusive education that meets the needs of diverse learners and prepares them for future success. As we continue to grow, Bultum Academy remains dedicated to fostering an engaging and supportive learning environment that empowers each student to thrive academically and personally.

During the year, Bultum Academy encountered the challenge of student retention, leading to a slight decrease in enrollment of 34 students. Nevertheless, the school's resilience and dedication allowed it to conclude the academic year with enrollment above its initial target. A testament to Bultum Academy's commitment to the community is its voluntary provision of education to approximately 22 pre-kindergarten students, offering early learning opportunities to young learners and supporting families in our community.





Attendance:


In its second year, Bultum Academy prioritized student attendance with a targeted range of 92 to 95 percent to achieve a performance rating at the satisfactory level. However, the commitment to fostering a positive learning environment led to an impressive outcome. Bultum Academy not only exceeded the set target but achieved a remarkable attendance rate of **95.07** percent.

This outstanding attendance rate not only surpassed the expectations for a satisfactory performance but also earned Bultum Academy the highest performance rating of exemplary for consistently exceeding the benchmark of 95 percent. The commitment of students, parents, and the school community to prioritize attendance has significantly contributed to creating a thriving and conducive learning environment.

Bultum Academy's second year attendance report reflects the dedication to promoting a culture of regular attendance, setting a solid foundation for continued success in subsequent academic years. III. Student Attrition

In the 2023-2024 academic year, Bultum Academy had an attrition rate of 5.65%, with 217 students enrolled by the end of the year. Despite this attrition, the school proactively addressed the gap by not only replacing these students but also exceeding initial enrollment expectations. As a result, student enrollment at the beginning of the new academic year rose to 230.

Note: Additional note added based on New Legislation:

Dissemination of Enrollment Procedures and Program Offerings:

In accordance with updated Minnesota legislation, Bultum Academy actively disseminated information about the school's enrollment procedures and academic offerings to targeted populations during the 2023–2024 school year. Outreach efforts included distributing flyers, hosting information sessions, attending community events, and utilizing multilingual communication to engage families, particularly those from historically underserved and underrepresented communities. These efforts aimed to ensure equitable access and awareness of Bultum Academy's educational opportunities for all prospective students and families.

Equitable Access to Highly Qualified Educators

Throughout the 2023-2024 academic year, all classroom teachers, specialists, and support staff at Bultum Academy held the required licensure for their assigned roles. When challenges arose in securing licensed teachers with the appropriate experience and background to effectively engage with our students, we proactively sought both internal and external candidates, successfully obtaining Tier 1 licenses for qualified individuals.



All grade-level teams engaged in collaborative planning across subjects to ensure alignment with state standards. Regardless of classroom placement, students were provided equal access to the same rigorous grade-level standards, fostering a robust and equitable learning environment.

VII. School Director Professional Development Plan

Bultum Academy places a strong emphasis on continuous professional development for our Executive Director to ensure effective leadership and alignment with the latest educational trends. During the 2023-2024 school year, our Executive Director actively participated in multiple professional development opportunities sponsored by the school's authorizer, NEO.





IX. Academic Performance

As our student body predominantly comprised individuals from minority racial and ethnic backgrounds, including recent immigrants to the country, with approximately **98.5%** designated as English Language Learners (ELL) and **85%** qualifying for free or reduced-price lunch, our student achievement objectives were aligned with the principles of the World's Best Workforce legislation. The primary focus was to ensure that all third-grade students attain grade-level literacy, with a concurrent commitment to closing all achievement gaps.

Our school has set strategic MCA-Math Goals for Grades 3-8 with a keen eye on surpassing the Columbia Heights resident district's averages. We've achieved a satisfactory level of performance with a proficiency rate of **24.10%**, which is **6.29** percentage points higher than the district's rate of **17.81%**. While we have not yet achieved an exemplary status — which would require us to be more than 10 percentage points above the district average — we are on a positive trajectory. Our efforts continue to focus on elevating our students' math proficiency as we strive to meet and exceed our targeted outcomes, contributing to the overarching objectives of the World's Best Workforce.

Note: Additional note added based on new legislation:

Implementing Bultum Academy's additional purposes:

Increase learning opportunities for all pupils: The School will increase learning opportunities and support educational equity by providing a high-quality STEM education for currently under-served populations. The School will increase learning opportunities by providing a longer than typical school year and school day. The School will also use the Multi-Tiered Support System (MTSS) which provides a highly responsive model for students to increase proficiency through a scaffolded and supportive learning approach. The process of moving students through the MTSS model allows for students to experience success as they move through a variety of increased learning opportunities that provide pathways to success.

Encourage the use of different and innovative teaching methods. Teachers will use a mix of direct teaching and hands-on learning, and collaborative teaching. The STEM focus at the early grades is different from typical elementary school approaches. In addition, Bultum Academy will be the first public school in Minnesota, and perhaps the nation, to provide Oromo language as an academic subject. In Minnesota there are public schools that provide Korean, Russian, Chinese, German, Arabic, French, Hebrew and Latin, but despite Oromo being among the top 10 primary home languages of students served in Minnesota (8th), no public school provides Oromo language as an academic subject.

- The school's combined proficiency rate of **25.17%** is **6.58** percentage points higher than the resident district's combined proficiency rate of **18.60%**.
- The school's performance has consistently exceeded the resident district's performance, achieving "Satisfactory" status for the two years with a noticeable proficiency gap maintained between the two groups.

To achieve "Exemplary" status, the school will need to increase the gap between its proficiency rate and the resident district's rate by more than 10 percentage points. Continued efforts will focus on math interventions for Grades 3-8 students to further close achievement gaps and boost proficiency rates.

- The school has consistently outperformed the resident district in reading proficiency, achieving "Satisfactory" status for both years reported.

To achieve "Exemplary" status, Bultum Academy must increase the gap between its proficiency rate and the resident district's rate to more than 10 percentage points. Further emphasis will be placed on reading interventions and support for students in Grades 3-8 to continue improving proficiency rates and outperforming the resident district.

- The school's combined proficiency rate of **35.48%** is slightly higher than the state average of **35.30%** for students from low-income households, indicating that the school is performing at the state average level.
- From the baseline proficiency rate of **33.33%**, the school showed improvement to **36.99%** in the second year, an increase of **3.65** percentage points.

Although the school has exceeded the state average slightly, continued focus is needed to further increase proficiency levels for this focus group. The goal for the coming years will be to achieve "Exemplary" status by widening the gap between Bultum Academy's performance and the state average by at least 10 percentage points. Efforts will include targeted interventions and support for low-income students to continue closing the achievement gap.

- The school's combined proficiency rate of **38.24%** is **9.48** percentage points higher than the state's combined proficiency rate of **28.75%**.
- The school made a substantial improvement, moving from **17.65%** proficiency in the baseline year to **58.82%** proficiency in 2023-2024, representing an increase of **41.18** percentage points.

To achieve "Exemplary" status, the school needs to increase the gap between its proficiency rate and the state average to more than 10 percentage points. Continued focus on science interventions and support for students from low-income households will help maintain the upward trajectory and further close the achievement gap.

- The school's combined proficiency rate of **25.81**% is **10.38** percentage points higher than the resident district's average of **15.42**%, marking an "Exemplary" status.
- While there was a slight decline in proficiency from the first to the second year, Bultum Academy still maintained a substantial gap over the resident district.

To continue maintaining "Exemplary" performance, the school will need to focus on strategies to boost math proficiency among students in this focus group. Targeted interventions will help increase proficiency rates and ensure sustained progress.

- The school demonstrated consistent improvement from **33.33%** to **36.99%** between the two years, with a proficiency gap significantly exceeding 10 percentage points over the resident district.

The school will aim to maintain its "Exemplary" performance by continuing to implement targeted reading interventions and support strategies for students from low-income households. Focus will be placed on maintaining and expanding the proficiency gap over the resident district.

- The school's combined proficiency rate of **38.24%** is **25.30** percentage points higher than the resident district's average of **12.94%**, indicating "Exemplary" performance.
- The school made significant gains in proficiency, moving from **17.65%** in the baseline year to **58.82%** in the second year, representing a **41.17** percentage point improvement.

To maintain this "Exemplary" status, Bultum Academy will continue focusing on strategies that have proven effective in raising science proficiency for students from low-income households. The goal is to sustain this high level of performance and further reduce any remaining gaps in science achievement.

- The school's proficiency rate declined slightly from **27.59%** to **24.69%** from the baseline year, showing a **2.89** percentage point decrease.

To maintain or improve its performance and achieve "Exemplary" status, Bultum Academy will need to either increase the proficiency rate to create a gap greater than 10 percentage points over the state or reverse the recent decline. The school will focus on targeted math interventions and additional support for multilingual learners to ensure sustained progress.

- Although the combined proficiency rate (**36.11%**) is still lower than the state average (**46.69%**), the improvement in performance is notable, particularly in the second year of the assessment.

Next Steps: To move towards exemplary status, the school will need to either continue improving to exceed the state average or aim to close the gap of 10.58 percentage points. Additional focus will be placed on targeted science interventions for Grades 5 and 8 students to further boost proficiency rates.

XI. Professional Development:

Continuous, job-embedded professional development remains a cornerstone of our commitment to excellence at Bultum Academy. The Academic Coach provides targeted observations and coaching to our dedicated teaching staff.

For the academic year 2023-2024, our professional development focuses on key areas:

The Science of Reading:

 This year, we are implementing the LETRS program (Language Essentials for Teachers of Reading and Spelling) as our primary framework for professional development in early literacy. We are now using FastBridge in place of aimswebplus to assess and monitor student progress, while continuing to utilize Groves Literacy Organization's interim assessment and The Science of Reading to inform early literacy instruction.

Data-Driven Instruction:

- Employing NWEA MAP data to inform English Language Arts (ELA) and Math instruction.
 Using classroom assessment data and NWEA MAP data to plan targeted small group instruction across all subject areas.
 - MobyMax has been integrated as a supplemental tool for personalized learning, allowing educators to tailor instruction to meet students' individual needs. Professional development focuses on utilizing MobyMax's features to enhance student engagement, track progress, and support differentiated instruction.

Cultural Competency:

• Professional development in cultural competency ensures that staff are equipped with the knowledge and skills to effectively engage with a diverse student body and foster an inclusive learning environment.

BARR Model (Building Assets, Reducing Risks):

- Focused on fostering student success by addressing social-emotional learning, building relationships, and removing barriers to achievement, the BARR model provides teachers with strategies to create a supportive, high-expectations environment.
- Verbal De-escalation Training:
- Teachers participate in verbal de-escalation training to manage challenging classroom behaviors and ensure that all students feel safe and supported in their learning environment.



During the workshop weeks in August and September, our teachers participated in full-day workshops covering:

- Introduction to new curricula, including Groves Literacy, HMH Reading, HMH Math, HMH Science, HMH Social Studies,
- Collaborative work to align curriculum standards with Minnesota State Standards.
- Effective classroom management strategies to optimize instructional time.

Furthermore, every Friday afternoon (with early student dismissal), teachers engage in 2 hours of professional development, accumulating close to 60 hours over the school year. Specific focus areas during these sessions include:

Reading Instruction:

- Science of Reading training sessions for teachers.
- Understanding Scarborough's rope and the components of a skilled reader.
- Mastery of individual skills required for proficient reading.
- Administration and utilization of data from aimsweb reading fluency assessments to guide whole-group and targeted small group instruction.

Classroom and Behavior Management:

- Low Burden, High Impact behavior interventions.
- Positive behavior reinforcement strategies.
- Anti-bullying methods, including ongoing training on incorporating SEL curriculum to foster positive character development and promote kindness among students.

Our focus on extended school hours, extensive professional development, and robust teacher coaching is designed to meet the specific needs of students eligible for free or reduced-price lunch, aligning with best practices supported by research.

Our language instruction is another standout feature of our innovative model. Students participate in two daily specialist classes, learning both Oromo and Arabic alongside English, the primary language of instruction. Research shows that exposure to native languages positively impacts academic success and English acquisition. Since approximately 95% of our students speak Oromo as their native language, this approach aligns with proven strategies for enhancing both school achievement and English proficiency.

Additionally, our daily physical education program ensures students engage in physical activity, complementing regular recess and supporting their overall well-being. This comprehensive approach underscores our dedication to providing a well-rounded, effective, and inclusive educational experience for all students.
